The aim of the workshop is to encourage GPs to find out how a little research will enhance their own practice. A good way to start is by exploring the scientific and didactic aspects of individual patient case reports.

Participants are asked to bring a usual, unusual or illustrative case of patients with typical or unexpected presentations, outcomes, adverse events etc relevant to women's health to the workshop. They will learn how to analyse, structure and write up a case report manuscript. During the workshop the facilitators will work with the participants to identify questions from the case reports that can be explored further in a research project.

- The best 3 case reports submitted *after* the conference to the conference organizers by 31st March 2009 will receive support with submission of the manuscript to a peer-reviewed journal.
- The best 2 research proposals submitted to the conference organizers by 31st March 2009 will be eligible for a grant.
